

Caring Hands Food Pantry

In May of 2016, there were 246 families that came to the pantry for assistance – 450 adults and 305 children for a total of 755 individuals served, Six thousand, one hundred eleven pounds of food was given out, not including lots of fresh fruit & vegetables, meat, breads, pastry items, and personal items. Fareway Stores at Altoona and Pleasant Hill and Brick Street Market at Bondurant totaled 244 \$8.00 vouchers handed out for perishable items such as milk, butter and eggs, or special dietary foods. Rent assistance checks for \$450.00 and utility assistance checks for \$990.27 were written as well. **Food needed this month: Canned Peas** 

A "Simple Supper" is provided for our food pantry clients the last Monday of each month from 5:30-6:30 p.m. at Adventure-Life Church, and is provided by churches, organizations and families in the SEP area. The June 27th meal will be provided by the Kiwanis, and on July 25th the Altoona Christian Church will prepare the meal.

Statistics for the Clothes Hanger for May are: 141 families assisted – (262 adults and 205 children) totaling 467 individuals. Clothing items given totaled 2,165 and household items, 39.

On behalf of our clients we say a "HUGE THANK YOU" to all of the individuals, churches, businesses, schools and organizations who are so very generous in donating food and finances to the pantry. It is all so much appreciated, and we pray your lives will be richly blessed.

### **Refugee Family**

In 1979 members of Altoona Christian Church took a leap of faith and accepted Gov. Robert Ray's challenge to make Iowa a haven for refugees of the recently ended war in Southeast Asia.

After 10 months of preparations and paperwork, the congregation welcomed the Ratsamy family formerly of Laos. The family spent time in a refugee camp in Thailand before arriving in the United States. The family included husband and wife Bounthong and Souvanny and their sons Somsack, Phouthasack, Bohnsack and Xayasack and daughter Deng and Bounthong's sister Bouasone.

John and Sarah Champion and their family and the late Ben and Alice Hall provided housing for the large family until permanent housing was arranged. Sarah Champion said the Ratsamys stayed with them for two weeks. Members donated furniture and other household items to furnish the family's new home.

Norma Stuart put her years as a teacher to work tutoring the family in English. She also helped with such things as learning to use American money.

"The father would sit at the table with me when I explained about the money. The women had to sit off to the side and watch," Norma said.

Georgia Woodward signed up the boys, all teenagers, for soccer. They proved to be good players.

"In no time at all people were cheering, 'Go Xayasack. Go Phouthasack,'" Woodward recalled.

Woodward, the Champions, the Halls and Doug and Norma Teuber were the committee leading the resettlement effort.

Church members found the Ratsamys to be hard working. The boys took jobs detasseling corn. The family raised their own food in a garden.

John Champion helped with the garden.

"One time I went to the garden and there was a lot of pigweed," John said. "Our son David went to eat with them and there was pigweed on the plate."

Sarah recalled a time when she was preparing food for a meal and threw away the tops of the green onions.

"The mother grabbed them out of the sink and chopped them up and put them in the food," Sarah said.

Woodward took them shopping at Hy-Vee.

"I began to realize how grossly affluent we are," Woodward said.

"They showed us how to stretch one chicken to feed eight people."

As the Ratsamys settled in and learned more English communications got better.

"Driving back from an English class in Des Moines on day the father kept looking through his book," Sarah said. "Finally he said, 'Our house has no bowls.""

### **Refugee Family**

The American hosts had not provided rice bowls in the furnishings they supplied.

Eventually the Ratsamys made contact with Laotian friends in the Twin Cities and decided to move there. Ben and Alice Hall and Norma and Dave Stuart helped them move.

The Ratsamys opened an Asian grocery and later added one in San Diego, Calif. The children grew up to marry, attend college and work in the family business.

On a trip to Minnesota in 1993, Norma and Dave stopped to see the Ratsamys at their store. The Stuarts saw how well the family combined what they learned from their American hosts with their thrift and hard work.

"While we were there, the father drove up in a big, shiny Mercedes," Norma said.

The Stuarts lost touch with the Ratsamys since that time.

Georgia said that the church received two donations of \$1,000 after the family moved to Minnesota.

Altoona Christian sponsored two more families, the Manivahns who settled permanently in Altoona and another family who stayed briefly in Des Moines before moving to Kansas City.

"That was a fun time," John Champion said.



Celebrate summer with this tasty dessert pizza, using your favorite summer fruits as the toppings.

### What you need:

- 1 tube slice-and-bake sugar cookie dough
- Knife
- Round pizza pan
- 8 ounces cream cheese
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup sugar
- ½ teaspoon vanilla
- 2 cups sliced fruit
- Adult help

### What you do:

- 1. Cut the dough into slices <sup>1</sup>/<sub>8</sub>-inch thick. Place slices on the pan, overlapping them slightly.
- 2. Bake at 375 degrees for 12 minutes. Let cool.
