

Comments after Prayer Vigil, Nov. 2 Rev. McKinna Daugherty

We gathered in solidarity with local police officers and Altoona area residents to sing, pray, and mourn together for the loss of life. Our prayers centered around themes of unity, peacemaking, and faith that God is present and does not forsake us in our grief. In giving thanks for the lives and the sacrifice of Sgt. Beminio and Ofc. Martin, we affirm that all life is sacred and that when one part of the human body is hurting, we all feel that pain. By drawing together and standing side by side, we are reminded that not one of us is alone, and the burden of our mourning is better borne together. In reading Psalm 46:1-7 we were reminded that God is our very present help in times of trouble and that God is with us now and always.


We prayed for peace, comfort, and strength for the families of Sgt. Beminio and Ofc. Martin. Their lives have been irrevocably disrupted, and they will need our prayers and support in a variety of ways. My prayer is that our brief vigil will inspire prayers for weeks and months and years to come, and that our candlelight is sign that we are standing with these families as they navigate the deep waters of grief. In the face of such trouble, it is natural to ask, "Where is God now?" We proclaim that even when our hearts are broken, our God is a God of peace and justice, and God is the light shining in the darkest night.

We prayed protection over all the officers in the Des Moines metro, including many of the Altoona Police who were present at this vigil. We know these officers have difficult jobs to do and they must do them even when they are afraid, worried, and grieving. We prayed that they would be sustained by the strength of God, and guided by wisdom in tense situations. We prayed for those tasked with investigating these murders, for the perpetrator of this violence, and for city officials and police chiefs as they lead in a turbulent time.

Those present were invited to write notes of support and prayers on banners for the officers' families, and for the Urbandale and Des Moines Police Departments.

In the face of such tragedy and deep sadness I often hear people ask, "Is prayer enough? What does it even do?" As a pastor, I sometimes wonder the same thing because the injustices of this world are so overwhelming. But I do know this: prayer is an act of love and it is one of many ways to offer love to one another. When we pray, it changes us slowly from the inside out and allows us to over time let go of anger, pain, and fear. It opens our hearts to hope, joy, and forgiveness. Prayer is not passive, for it moves us to peaceful action. We all have the potential and responsibility to seek peace and offer love to each other, not just to those who are easy to love but also and especially with those who are hard to love. We must draw the circle of love wider and wider each day, until no one stands alone and we are all side by side.



Knitting (with a twist) Returns to ACC

The round loom knitters have taken their skills on the road! In November and December several members of ACC are visiting Hoyt Middle School in Des Moines to teach fifteen 6th, 7th and 8th grade girls how to knit using round looms. The Blazing Stars, a girls leadership group meets on Thursdays from 2:30 to 4:30 and for the next few weeks, several members of ACC will be joining them. The church members are teaching the girls round loom knitting to promote creativity, relaxation and self-sufficiency. During the four week period the girls will complete a baby cap to be donated to charity. If they enjoy knitting and wish to continue, they may then knit caps for themselves, family members or charity. After just one session, the girls seem to be catching on quickly and all are enjoying the multi-generational fellowship. Their teachers are: Jane Ferguson, Sue Renaud, Carol Nieters, Bob Gulling, John Champion, Pat Miller, and Laurie Kolstead.

The beginning knitter's class will be offered in January. This class will be open to all members of the church, their friends and families and residents of Prairie Vista Village. The knitting fellowship will also resume in January and continue monthly through March. Caps completed during that time will be donated to John Stoddard Cancer Center, the Clothes Hangar at Caring Hands and an elementary school in SE Polk. Dates will be announced in December.

Ruth O'Connor—Caring Hands Food Pantry

In October of 2016, 306 families came to the food pantry for assistance - 534 adults and 408 children, for a total of 942 persons served. There were 7,604 pounds of food given, not counting the bread, cookies, cakes and fruits and vegetables donated by some of the local stores. Apples were shared with the pantry from persons who had more than they could use. Vouchers for \$8.00 were handed out to be used at the Fareway Stores at Altoona or Pleasant Hill or the Brick Street Market at Bondurant, to 304 families. These are used for perishable items like milk, butter, eggs, etc. that we cannot keep at the pantry. Personal items such as soap, diapers, shampoo, toothbrushes, toothpaste etc. are also given.

Personal items such as soap, diapers, shampoo, toothbrushes, toothpaste etc. are also given. Laundry detergent can be given every other month. Rent assistance checks for \$ 450.00 and utility assistance checks for \$ 476.00 were written.

Food needed this month: Green Beans

A "Simple Supper" is provided for our food pantry clients the last Monday of each month from 5:30 - 6:30 p.m. at Adventure-Life Church, and is provided by churches, organizations and families in the SEP area. Dee Bucklin will provide the meal on November 28, and on **Sunday**, **December 18**th from 5:00 - 7:00 p.m. a Christmas dinner will be served to all our food pantry clients. Statistics for the Clothes Hanger for October are: 174 families assisted - (337 adults and 289 children) totaling 626 individuals. Clothing items given totaled 3,377 and household items, 87. On behalf of our clients we say a "HUGE THANK YOU" to all of the individuals, churches, businesses, schools and organizations who are so very generous in donating food and finances to the pantry. It is all so much appreciated, and we pray your lives will be richly blessed.
