


On January 27, our Elders gathered for an overnight retreat at the Christian Conference Center in Newton for training, prayers, and fellowship. The following day, members of the board joined with the elders for discussion and training sessions led by Bill and Amy Spangler-Dunning on the history of the roles of board and elders in the Christian Church, and healthy communication methods. Our conversations were rich and commitment to leadership is strong!

On January 23-25, pastors from all over the Upper Midwest gathered for Minister's Institute at the Christian Conference Center in Newton, Iowa. Rabbi Sandy Sasso was our keynote speaker. She is a teacher, author, and storyteller. She is currently director of "The Religion, Spirituality & the Arts Seminar," a partnership between Butler University and Christian Theological Seminary. She written several nationally acclaimed children's books, including *God's Paintbrush, In God's Name*, and *Noah's Wife: The Story of Na'amah* -which was selected by Publisher's Weekly as a Best Books of the Year. She has also written books for adults including *Midrash: Reading the Bible with Question Marks*. Pastor McKinna also attended a workshop on "Evaluating Ministries" led by Rev. Jonna Jensen, Associate Conference Minister for the Iowa Conference of the United Church of Christ, and another on "Evangelism" by Rev. Tiff Williams, Associate Regional Minister for the Christian Church in the Upper Midwest. In addition to various learning opportunities, Ministers Institute offers a chance for fellowship, rest, and conversation with colleagues near and far.

Altoona Christian Church January 23, 2017 Board Meeting Minutes

Attendees: J.C. Horton, Russ Wilkins, Chris Williams (on vacation), Wayne Patchin, Kristin Patchin J.C. called the meeting to order at 7:06 PM and Pastor McKinna opened the meeting with prayer

Old Business:

Judy Wadding and Wanda Newell, from the Outreach Committee, were in attendance to discuss National Night Out and That Night in Bethlehem becoming a part of the Outreach Committee. They expressed concerns regarding the need for both of these committees to be a part of Outreach. As per the church's by-laws adopted in 2013, it states that only the committee chair is responsible for creating sub-teams.

It was not the board's intention to circumvent the by-laws by suggesting they were to become part of Outreach. The board felt that both of these committees were a part of the broader scope of the entire church's Outreach to the community. There was discussion on the matter. J.C. moved that National Night Out and That Night in Bethlehem report directly to the Vice Moderator, rather than to the Outreach Committee, moving forward. The board approved this motion by consensus.

Wanda raised concerns about the Outreach Committee's funding. As approved by the congregation at the December 18th, 2016, congregational meeting, the Outreach Committee was given a budget estimated on previous year's expenditures. Wanda brought to the board's attention that there are different versions of the by-laws that are in circulation. The board agreed to investigate this matter and will take further action as needed knowing that a by-laws review is forthcoming this year. For now we will proceed as we have planned, not having to take interest income from the Christian Church Foundation, but the board agreed that if monies are taken, 10 percent of money withdrawn will be distributed to Outreach.

J.C. mentioned the Venture Scouting Program. The board decided to not take any action until we hear back from them.

New Business:

J.C. asked the incoming board members to think and pray over what they feel the goals and objectives for the coming year for the church board should be, and we will discuss these at the February meeting.

Pastoral Report:

Pastor McKinna presented her report to the board outlining her goals for the first couple months of the year, which include:

- Meet with incoming leadership
- Getting ready to launch a new bible study
- Preparing for the Lenten season
- Continue working on 150th Anniversary
- Working with Worship and Growth Committees as they innovate

McKinna also presented some new ideas for supporting the ministry table leaders with resources and processes. She also stated that she has completed her annual standing form with the region, which includes over 120 hours of continuing education in 2016.

Board Reports:

At Large: Nothing to report

Elders: Wayne stated that the Elders will meet once a month. He is working on group unity, and is striving to create a Christian, caring group for congregational support.

Financial Secretary: No report provided.

Treasurer: Russ presented an updated profit and loss statement and balance sheet. Everything is looking as projected. **Memorial Fund:** Chris submitted an updated Memorial Fund summary.

Personnel: Kristin noted that she still needs the keys to the personnel filing cabinet and Russ was going to work on it. She needs to submit the proper paper work for the pension fund. She is in the process of soliciting feedback on Pastor McKinna and will provide an update when everything is compiled.

Vice Moderator: Tony presented a list of repairs that need to be done from the Property team. Property is requesting a total allocation to refresh the church. Much discussion was had on this subject and the proposal of a long-term funding campaign was presented. J.C. moved to table the motion for now for further discussion and prayer on the subject. (J.C. will present this matter for discussion and prayer during the board and elder retreat on Saturday, January 28th.)

Russ shared a closing prayer. Meeting was adjourned at 10:02 PM. Respectfully submitted,



Ruth O'Connor—Caring Hands Food Pantry

November of 2016, found 326 families (a record for the year) coming to the food pantry for assistance - 592 adults and 435 children, for a total of 1,027 persons served. There were 8,150 pounds of food given, not counting the bread, cookies, cakes and fruits and vegetables donated by some of the local stores. Vouchers for \$8.00 were handed out to 319 families to be used at the Fareway Stores at Altoona or Pleasant Hill or the Brick Street Market at Bondurant, to be used for perishable items like milk, butter, eggs, etc. that we cannot keep at the pantry.

Personal items such as shampoo, soap, toilet tissue, toothbrushes, toothpaste, diapers, etc. are also given. Laundry detergent can be given every other month. Rent assistance checks for \$1,112.76 and utility assistance checks for \$ 847.66 were written.

Food needed this month: Chili beans & egg noodles

A "Simple Supper" is provided for our food pantry clients the last Monday of each month from 5:30 - 6:30 p.m. at Adventure-Life Church, and is provided by churches, organizations and families in the SEP area. On **Sunday**, **December 18**th from 5:00 - 7:00 p.m. (note change of day and time) a Christmas dinner will be served to all our food pantry clients provided by various churches in the SEP area. We want to say a Huge Thank You to the Bob & Sharon Townsend family who again donated a semi load of food to the Caring Hands Food Pantry in December.

Statistics for the Clothes Hanger for November are: 207 families assisted (371 adults and 339 children) totaling 710 individuals. Clothing items given totaled 3,563 and household items, 77. The Clothes Hanger is badly in need of girl's new panties/underwear in all sizes.

On behalf of our clients we say "THANK YOU" to all of the individuals, churches, businesses, schools and organizations who are so very generous in donating food and finances to the pantry. It is all so much appreciated, and we pray your lives will be richly blessed.


